With a variety of national and international gastronomic alternatives, on Constitución and Mallinkrodt streets, the neighborhood is recognized for its lively nightlife and its familiar atmosphere right at the feet of San Cristóbal hill (funicular and cable car entrance). It has shops for crafts and souvenirs, theaters and cultural activities. La Chascona House Museum, from Nobel Prize of Literature, Pablo Neruda, is located in the heart of the neighborhood.

One of the three houses of the Nobel Prize of Literature, Pablo Neruda, who built it, starting in 1953, for his great secret love (at that time) Matilde Urrutia. In her honor, he named the house "La Chascona", alluding to her abundant reddish hair. Nowadays, it is open to the public to exhibit the life of the poet, bringing people closer to his intimate environments in which he lived and created.
